Article #2 Hole –In –One Club

All members have the option of participating in the Hole-In-One club. Registration can occur by checking the appropriate area on membership renewal form in January. Additional registration will be available in the spring at the golf pro shop

Details:

If a member in the hole-in-one club records a hole in one a \$5.00 (GST Included) charge will be applied to ALL members participating.

The resulting pool will be dispensed to the lucky player as follows:

50% Pro Shop Voucher

50% Bar Credit to be used that day for traditional “round of drinks”

Additional:

The lucky “Ace” will also receive a Hole In One Award compliments of Whitewater Golf Club

Article #3 Member Advisory Committee

An advisory committee member must be and remain in good standing and have paid full initiation fee

Committee comprised of:

- 4 Gentlemen
- 2 Ladies

Committee Term:

- 2 years

Role

- To work with Club Management on dealing with member concerns
- Planning, organizing and promotion of club events
- To be the liaison for the membership at large and Club Management
- To be Ambassadors of the Club

Nominations:

Committee members are nominated by fellow members

- Male Members can nominate a Male Member
- Female Members can nominate a Female Members
- Nominations must have the authorization of the nominated member
- All nominations must be approved by the Club
- Approved nominations will then be carried to an election
- Election will be by secret ballot and will occur over a specified time period
- Members must be 19 years of age to participate in the election process

Administration

Article #4 Membership renewals

- All membership dues categories are automatically renewed as of January 1st at the discretion of Whitewater Golf Club
- Memberships will be billed at the previous season's level on January 31 and are to be paid in full prior to March 31st
- Renewals not paid in full by March 31st are subject to a 5% additional fee
- Termination or changes to membership dues categories must be made in writing prior to January 31st
- Dues not paid in full will result in the suspension of member privileges until dues are paid in full
- Members must be in good standing at the time of renewal

Article #5 Death of a Member:

Single Full Initiation fee

- Membership will be terminated in the event of death.
- Initiation fees and dues are non refundable
- Memberships are not capable of being gifted, granted or bequeathed by will or otherwise

Couple Principal Initiation fee

- Membership will be terminated in the event of death.
- Initiation fees and dues are non refundable
- Spouse may continue at a Spousal Membership for the 1st season
- Spouse may continue membership levels at an Enhanced, Principal, Senior or Associate Dues Level for subsequent years.

Article # 6 Medical Leave

- Member must be in good standing
- Written request must be made and include medical documentation
- All medical leaves are at the sole discretion of Whitewater Golf Club
- Annual Dues are non refundable but a prorated portion as determined by management may be applied upon reinstatement to the following seasons dues
- Food and Beverage Minimum will be waived or pro rated determined by time away
- Members reinstated during the same season as the leave will pay a pro rated dues level plus a 10% administration fee
- All medical leaves are void as of November 30 in the season they occur

- Members will be renewed at the dues level upon which the medical leave was taken
- Members may apply for additional Medical Leave as outlined above

Article #7 Member House Charging Accounts

- Enhanced, Principal, Senior, Spousal and Associate membership categories are eligible to set up a club charging account
- Administration must have a valid credit card on file at all times
- All House Account Balances will be reconciled with the Credit Card on file the 1st week after the month in which the purchases were made.
 - June balance will be applied to the credit card the 1st week of July
- Members will be issued a membership card/swipe card
- Member will be required to have a photo taken that will come up on the screen to help ensure charging accuracy
- Cards will be required in order to put a charge on your house account
- Lost Cards must be reported to Administration as soon as possible
- Lost cards will be replaced at a charge of \$15.00/card
- Members are requested to sign all chits at the time of purchase
- All chits will be closed off and signed at the completion of the sale
 - i.e.) Chits will not be left “open” in the clubhouse while members are on the course
- Members will be issued a monthly statement at the end of each month outlining the purchases and the amount owing
- All balances are due upon receipt
- Overdue accounts will be charged at 2% per month and can result in suspension of signing privileges and suspension/termination of membership
- Account will be deemed overdue at the end of the month following the charges
 - IE. June statement will be overdue if not paid by July 31st

Article #8 Food and Beverage Minimums (May 1st to October 31st)

\$500.00 per individual membership

\$750.00 per couple membership

- Monthly Statements will indicate the remaining balance of the Minimum
- Accounts not meeting the Food and Beverage Minimum will be billed the difference on the October 31st statement
- To ensure all spending is being tabulated for the Food and Beverage it is up to the member to initiate all transactions with the member swipe card or account number. The sales can then be settled (paid) by account, credit card, debit card or cash.
- Only food and beverage (alcohol and non alcohol) apply to the minimum (Gratuities and taxes are not applied to the minimum)

Article #9 Personal Items/Injury

The Club respectfully reminds our members that we are not responsible for any equipment members and/or guests store on Club premises, or for personal effects left in the Clubhouse. Therefore, members are to ensure their equipment and other belongings are covered appropriately by their own insurance policies.

Each golfer assumes all risk and danger incidental to the game of golf (on course or practice facility), including being struck by errant or misdirected golf balls, carts and releases the Club, its affiliates and all employees and agents from any and all liabilities resulting from such causes.

Article # 11 Dress Code/Style Code

Clubhouse Style Code:

Smart Casual

Whitewater would like all of our members and guests to be comfortable and relaxed while enjoying our atmosphere and therefore we do not require formal attire while in the clubhouse. Denim, tasteful athletic wear, sandals, and basic tasteful attire is acceptable. It is necessary to indicate that casual attire not in good repair, torn or showing considerable wear may not be appropriate. Please use your best judgment in choosing your attire keeping in mind the guidelines described above. Persons deemed by staff and management to not be dressed appropriately will be asked politely to change or asked to leave. Please ensure your guests are informed and if in doubt please inquire with a staff member.

Golf Course and Practice Facility Dress Code:

Traditional Golf

Dress Code decisions are at the discretion of the Golf Professional Shop. If you are unsure of your attire please inquire with the staff

Dress Code Guidelines:

Men:

- Turtleneck, long and short sleeve mock neck shirts, and collared golf shirts are acceptable. T-shirts are not acceptable.
- Denim, rugby, sweats, jogging or sloppy cargo pants are not acceptable attire.

- Bermuda-length shorts are appropriate; however the Club does not permit shorts that fall below the knee. Denim, sloppy cargo shorts and spandex shorts are also inappropriate.
- Socks of any length are acceptable.

Men's dress code also applies to Junior Boys.

Ladies:

- Sleeveless tops are acceptable, provided they have a collar. Conversely, any top without a collar must have sleeves. Turtleneck, long and short sleeve mock necks, and traditional golf shirts are also acceptable.
- Halter tops, tube tops and tank tops are not acceptable.
- Denim, rugby, sweat, jogging, cargo, stirrup pants and tights are not acceptable attire; however the Club does permit Capri pants.
- Bermuda-length shorts and skirts are appropriate; however the Club does not permit short skirts and shorts. Denim, cargo and spandex shorts are also inappropriate.
- Socks of any length are acceptable.

Ladies' dress code also applies to Junior Girls

Foot Wear:

- Non Metal spikes are mandatory
- Soft soled shoes are permitted (tennis, running shoes)
- Cleats of any type are strictly prohibited

Article #12 Code of Conduct:

- Members of Whitewater Golf Club will be expected, at all times, to respect and adhere to the general standards of conduct.
- Maintain courteous relations with the Club, staff and fellow Members
- Maintain the highest standards of personal conduct so as to reflect credit and add stature to the Club.
- Familiarize themselves with and abide by the spirit and letter of all rules and regulations of the Club and the Membership Plan as approved by the Board of Directors.
- Observe the highest standards of conduct and integrity when representing the Club at outside events.
- Address concerns, in writing, only to Club's General Manager. Please do not directly confront fellow Members, guests or staff.
- These standards of conduct have been created to ensure the maximum enjoyment of all Members of Whitewater Golf Club. Any breach of these standards may be subject to disciplinary action, as determined by management.

Members may be reprimanded, suspended, or have membership privileges terminated if deemed to have (not limited to)

- Failure to abide by the spirit and the letter of the rules and regulations
- Abusive behavior, either verbal or physical, directed toward other members, their guests, or Club employees or King George home owners
- Coarse or loud conversations that might embarrass others.
- Poor golf etiquette, such as hitting into the group in front of you, slow play, or failure to comply with staff enforcing golf course policy.
- Behavior that is unbecoming or life threatening.
- Non-compliance with our dress code both on and off the golf course.
- Members disciplining other members or staff.
- Failure to pay dues, fees or charges on house account in a timely manner
- Failure to maintain minimum membership requirements
- Failure to report or pay for damages caused by the member, their guests or sponsored individuals
- Permit, have knowledge or partake in fraudulent activities involving actions against the club or member accounts

Club management will deal with all matters pertaining to the club, its operation, employees, and all member issues or discipline actions as required in writing and all documentation will remain in confidence. Members may request a review of the disciplinary action in writing within a 7 day period of notification by the Club. The Club will set a date and time for such review within 7 days of the request.

Notwithstanding suspension or termination of membership, the member will remain liable for any accounts unpaid or due Whitewater Golf Club. Refunds to any part of dues or fees will not be permissible as result of suspension or termination of membership.

Article #13 Bag Storage

- Members with bag storage will be issued a stall number and a bag tag denoting the stall number
- Personal power caddies and pull carts will not be permitted in storage due to space limitations
- The Club respectfully reminds our members that we are not responsible for any equipment members and/or guests store on Club premises, or for personal effects left in the Clubhouse. Therefore, members are to ensure their clubs and other belongings are covered appropriately by their own insurance policies.

Article #14 Lockers

- Members with lockers will be issued a locker number each season
- Members are asked to clean out their lockers at the end of the season for locker maintenance.
- Towel service is available and all towels must remain in the locker room area.
- Members are asked to place soiled towels in the designated areas to help maintain a tidy facility
- Towels are not to be kept inside a members locker

Article #15 Hours of Operation

Golf Course: May 1 to October 15th

- Golf Course Superintendent will open and close the course according to weather and playing conditions and will be announced to the membership each season
- Starting Times will vary through out the season and will be posted in the Golf Pro Shop

Golf Academy: Open: 1 hour prior to the 1st tee time
Close: Dusk unless otherwise posted

Club House: The clubhouse will open 1 hour prior to the 1st tee time and closing times are dependant on traffic patterns and club usage.

Administration:

April 15 to November 15: Monday to Friday 8:30 AM - 4:30 PM
Off Season: To Be Announced

Golf

Article #16 Course Access

Only members, guests, public player and those with Golf Pro Shop approval are permitted on the Golf Course. Biking, hiking, walking and the like are not permitted on the Golf Course and violators will be considered trespassers and will be dealt with accordingly

Article #17 Starting Times

The first available starting time will be posted in the Pro Shop and will vary on:

- Weather Patterns
- Day Light Hours
- Golf Course Maintenance

Times will be dispensed on a first requested first given basis
Play may not begin prior to the first scheduled tee time

Article #18 Tee Time Booking/Cancellation

- Members are permitted 10 day advance booking (See membership categories for restrictions)
- Booking available by telephone, in person or via our internet booking service
- All names playing in the group will be required at the time of booking
- The booking member will be responsible for all players in the group and will be subject to no show penalties if the foursome is not complete
- Tee times and individual players within the group must be cancelled 24 hours prior or the booking member will be recorded as having a “no show” and subject to the policy below and all applicable green fees for guests will be charged.
- The booking member will be denoted on the tee sheet in the first column of the tee time
- The booking member will be recorded for a “No Show” if
 - Entire group does not show and time was not cancelled 24 hours prior
 - Any individual listed to play in the time does not show or is not cancelled 24 hours prior
- Booking members will receive 3 written warnings
- After the 3rd warning the booking member will be charged the appropriate green fee for all players that are booked and not cancelled
- Tee Time blocking will not be permitted and will be subject to the above penalties
- In order to maximize utilization and maintain the pace of play twosomes and single players may be asked to join at the discretion of the Pro Shop, Starter or Marshal.

Article #19 Check In

- All players must register with the Golf Pro Shop prior to play. Violators will be deemed to be trespassers and dealt with accordingly.
- King George Home Owners must check in with the Pro Shop and all play must commence from the 1st tee. Access to the course from home owner property is strictly prohibited
- Players must check in with the Pro Shop 20 minutes prior to tee time
- Players must be at the tee 10 minutes prior to tee time
- Failure to do so may result in the loss of the tee time and players will be required to book an alternative tee time
- Play will commence on Forest #1 unless otherwise posted
- Play starting on River #1 (Hole #10) is prohibited unless authorized by the Golf Professional Shop Staff

Article #20 Member Only Access

Specific tee times may be blocked for member play only as the traffic patterns dictate. This will ensure access to the course for our membership.

Wednesday Men's Night:

Date: Mid May to End of September
Blocked Times: 12:00 to 5:00 PM
Tee Times will be blocked for member play until 48 hours prior
Open to all Enhanced, Principal, Spousal, Senior, Associate, Student and Intermediate Members
Guests: Only on a 1:1 Member Ratio and are not eligible for contests
Format: Various weekly contests
Must have an established Handicap Factor

Wednesday Ladies Morning:

Dates: Mid May to Mid September
Blocked Times: 9:00 AM to 10:00AM
Tee Times will be blocked for member play until 48 hours prior
Open to All Enhanced, Principal, Senior, Spousal, Associate, Student and Intermediate Members
Guests: Only on a 1:1 Member Ratio and are not eligible for contests
Format: Various Weekly Fun Contests

Tuesday Night Ladies

Dates: June to September
Blocked Tee Times: 6:15 PM 9 Hole Shotgun
Clinics: 5:30 PM
Open to all Players joined in the league
Guests: Only on a 1:1 Ratio and are not eligible for contests

Format: Various Fun Games
NOTE: See Yearly Member Event Program for more details and for additional member events

Article #21 Outside Events

The Club reserves the right to host outside golf events. These events may be in the form of shotgun starts, cross over or regular tee times. The club will communicate to the membership the course closure as far in advance as possible.

The club reserves the right to book starting times for events, special occasions, golf vacations, and hotel/resort guests.

Article #22 Non Member Play

- Non member play is available to the public
- 5 day advance booking only
- Not available during member only tee times
- 24 Hour Cancellation Policy in effect

Article #23 Rain Check/Credit Policy

Rain Checks will be issued only on the day of play and is at the sole discretion of the Golf Professional Shop staff. The following guideline will apply:

- If Players play 5 holes or less- 18 Hole Rain Check
- If players play 13 or fewer holes- 9 Hole Rain Check
- If players play more than 13 Holes- No rain check

NOTE: If you start in the rain the rain check policy is not applicable

Article #24 Lightning

If lightning is in the area all play shall cease. It is each individual's responsibility to be aware of lightning and seek shelter. The Club will sound a horn (long blasts) as soon as it becomes aware. Players are to seek shelter immediately. The Halfway Hut is a Grounded area. The Club will sound the horn (short blasts) to resume play

Golf Power Carts

Article #25 Fees:

Power Cart Package: \$600.00 + GST, PST

- Members (cart package holder) have the option to purchase a cart package for the season
- Fee covers the members cart fee for his/her cart ride (seat) for the season
- Subject to cart availability (this is not a cart reservation)

Spousal Cart Package Additional \$300.00+GST, PST

- Spouse must be cart package holder
- Entitles both spouses to only 1 power cart on course
- If one spouse is on course with cart using the package then the other spouse must pay applicable cart fees to ride

Annual Trail Fee: \$500.00 +GST

- Must be a resident of King Georges Park
- Cart must be electric powered
- Cart must be approved for use by Whitewater

Member Pay as you Ride Fees:

- 18 Hole Full Ride \$28.00
- 9 Hole Full Ride \$22.00

Members may split the charges of a full ride:

- 18 Hole Shared Cart \$14.00
- 9 Hole Shared Cart \$11.00

GST, PST not included

Article #26 Cart Rules

- Operators must be 16 years of age and possess a valid G2 or G Drivers Licence
- Power Carts must remain on cart paths 20 yards from each green (denoted by cart directional signs) and beyond the following tee block
- Keep power carts on the cart paths when advised and observe all cart directional signs
- Please observe traffic control measures including traffic control signs, ropes, painted lines and barriers. If a traffic-related guide or barrier interferes with a golf shot, move and replace it following the shot.
- The Club does not allow power carts in fescue or environmentally sensitive areas.
- Reduce speed when approaching or crossing bridges and when traveling downhill.
- The Club allows a maximum of two sets of golf clubs and 2 passengers on a cart
- To minimize wear and tear on the golf course and maximize power cart efficiency, players should employ the minimum number of power carts necessary (i.e. if two members of a foursome wish to ride they should ride together).
- All Power Carts must be signed for prior to use (Daily Fee and Cart Packages)

Article #27 Medical Carts

The Club's medical cart program exists under the following guidelines:

- The Club will only extend medical cart privileges to those golfers who **MUST** have a cart to play the game. Once on the medical list, a member must take a cart each time they play or the Club will rescind his/her medical cart status.
- The member must provide a doctor's letter annually which clearly states that the member cannot play without a cart.

- All qualifying members will sign a form which outlines the "Medical Cart Rules & Regulations." Failure to adhere to these rules will result in the Club revoking medical cart privileges.
- A medical cart member must share a medical cart if two medical cart members are playing in the same group.
- On normal (dry) days, medical cart members may share carts as per the usual practice.
- Medical carts will carry a handicap sign at all times.

Article #28 Electronic Power Caddies/Pull Carts

- Pull carts are available to members at no additional fees
- Please keep all pull carts and caddies away from tees, greens, aprons and areas between bunkers and greens when possible
- The Club will not be able to store member's electronic caddies or pull carts

Article #29 Rules of Golf

- The rules of play shall be those the Royal Canadian Golf Association approves, except where either the scorecard or authorized signs on the course state local rules.
- A single player has no standing on the course.
- Each player must have his/her own equipment (Rental sets are available)
- Handicap indexes shall be those that the Royal Canadian Golf Association and Canadian Ladies' Golf Association fixes.
- Players must enter all scores on the handicap computer in the Golf Shop after each round. The Golf Committee may invoke penalties for those who do not enter their scores in accordance with the Rules of Golf.
- All members must post a minimum of five games before they are eligible to play in Club handicap events
- Players not entering scores on a regular basis may be refused entry into member events
- The Golf Shop and Professional Staff have full authority to enforce the rules and report violations for appropriate action
- Entry onto adjacent home owner property is strictly prohibited and is trespassing. Violators will be removed from the facility
- Entry onto Environmentally Protected areas (denoted by red stakes with green top) is prohibited

Article #30 Pace of Play 4 Hours 20 Minutes

Groups determined to be "out of position" will be asked to speed up and if groups continue to be out of position will be asked to pick up and move directly into position.

Out of position is defined as being 1 or more holes behind the group in front or exceeding the allotted time of play.

KEEPING UP TO THE GROUP INFRONT WILL ENSURE THE PACE OF PLAY IS ADHERED TO.

Whitewater is a “READY GOLF” facility

Ready Golf:

- All players must arrive at the 1st tee 10 minutes prior to their scheduled tee time
- Honor is determined by the first player ready to hit.
- It is not a penalty under the Rules of Golf to play out of turn as long as there is acknowledgement from your fellow players.
- Let shorter hitter play first
- After hitting return to your clubs and prepare to proceed
- All players are responsible for marking errant shots
- Players should proceed directly to their own shots and then assist in searching after hitting
- Park carts/clubs to rear of the green on the cart path in the direction of the next tee
- Always be ready to play
 - Plan your shot and select your club while others are hitting
 - Line up putts before your turn to play
 - When possible continue putting until the ball is holed (avoid marking when possible)
- Mark the card on the next tee
- Implement Equitable Stroke Control when experiencing difficulty

Ready Golf is a team effort. All players must make a concerted effort to play quickly. It only takes one group to back up an entire course. Don't let it be your group.

The Golf Professional, Pro Shop Staff, Starters, Marshals and Outside Service staff are all empowered to help maintain the pace of play standard so please adhere to their advice and direction.

Article #31 Practice

- All practice is to be limited to designated practice areas only
- Players are urged to limit golf balls played to the rules of golf only
- Players are urged to refrain from taking turf on practice swings

Article #32 Golf Academy

- Posted practice area rules must be adhered to at all times
- Only Whitewater Practice Balls are to be used
- Practice Balls are not to be removed from the Practice Facility under any circumstance

- Bucket slips must be obtained from the Golf Pro Shop and balls will be dispensed from the ball machine at the Academy Building
- Players must use only the designated hitting area denoted by the roped area
- Golf Dress Code applies to the Golf Academy/Practice Area (See Dress Code for details)
- Designated Practice Facility Shuttle Carts will be available (cart rules and regs apply)
- During busy course periods the shuttle carts may not be available and the Shuttle Cart (6 man) will be in service
- Please park power carts in the designated areas at the Practice Facility

Chipping/Sand Play Area

Green located at the Academy is for Chipping, Pitching and Sand Play Only
Putting is prohibited

Putting Green

Located at the starters Hut the green is for putting only
Chipping or pitching is prohibited

Food and Beverage:

Food and non-alcoholic beverages may not be brought to the Club or the Golf Course for the purpose of consuming anywhere on Club property unless previously approved by the General Manager. All alcohol consumed on site must be purchased strictly from Whitewater Golf Club. All products will be confiscated and violators maybe asked to leave the premises.

Article # 33 LIQUOR LICENCE LAWS

The laws of the province of Ontario (L.C.B.O.) govern the Club's service of alcohol by its staff to members and guests. The law prevents the Club from selling or serving alcohol to a person if that sale or service would apparently intoxicate that person or increase that person's intoxication so much that he or she would be in danger of causing injury or damage to another.

The legal drinking age in Ontario is 19. The Club will not serve alcoholic drinks to anyone under the legal drinking age. In an effort to ensure this, Club staff may ask members and/or their guests to produce the appropriate identification. We expect the full co-operation of its members and their guests when asked for identification.

Overcrowding is another concern of the Club. The law allows for a maximum number of members and guests on the premises, and the Club will restrict admission to the maximum number of occupants that the Liquor Licence Board posts in each room.

So as not to jeopardize the Club, its members, or others, each of the Club's employees who serve alcoholic beverages have been Smart Serve Certified and are to refuse to serve any person requesting service of alcoholic beverages in apparent violation of the law. It is imperative that the unrestricted judgment and discretion of the Club's staff must govern these situations. Therefore, members must not only respect but observe any employee who refuses to serve a member or guest (even if the member or his or her guest feels aggrieved by that decision) without adverse comment or any breach of the normal decorum we expect and require of the Club's membership.

Article #34 Smoking

The Clubhouse has been designated a smoke free environment. Smoking is permitted on the patio and areas outside of the clubhouse. Please dispose of all cigarette/cigar debris in appropriate containers or ashtrays.

Article #35 Restricted Areas

No member may enter the kitchen, bar, bag storage, maintenance area or staff quarters without the express permission of the Manager or Senior Staff member on duty.

Article #36 Pets

The Club does not allow pets (except seeing eye dogs) in the Clubhouse. All pets must be kept on a leash at all times and those owners are responsible for cleaning up any and all excrement.

Article #37 Children

All children under the age of 14 must be with adult supervision at all times while on the property. Children under the age of 16 are not permitted into the locker room areas
