CN Future Links Clinics (Ages 6-11)

CN Future Links Clinics are designed for children ages 6-11 years of age. This fun, active, and group based program is designed to introduce the game through a series of fun activities while learning the fundamentals of golf.

- Times: Saturday afternoons 1:00 pm - 2:00 pm
- Clinic 1 Dates: 4 weeks - May 7, 14, 21, 28

CN Future Links Half Day Junior Camps are designed for children ages 6-11 and 12-18 years of age working within the LTPD (Long Term Player Development guide for golf) Levels 1-4 of Golf Canada and Future Links 7 level "Learn to Play" program will be incorporated in these camps (www.future-links.org). This fun, active, and group based program is designed to introduce the game through a series of fun activities that focuses on the fundamentals and key golf skills of putting, chipping, driving, and iron play. This program will run Monday-Friday and 9 holes of golf will also be included (based on course availability).

Leaders in this skills challenge will be nationally ranked with a possible opportunity to participate in the CN Future Links National Championships.
